



Information - Summer School 2024

Dear Parents, Dear Legal Guardians,

Summer school 2024 takes place in the last two weeks of the summer holidays and gives children from 0-8th grade the chance to go over the work they have done in the last school year. Lessons are held in small groups.

Older children have the chance to get to know what it is like to be a teacher and take part in a full programme as a 'Buddy'.

Summer school is free. You can register your child via the form you will get from your child's school. Please fill out the form and give it to your child's class teacher by the **26th of April 2024** at the latest.

You can see on the registration form if your child's school is a summer school or not. If not, it will tell you where the summer school for your child will be.

The City of Vienna offers afternoon care (including lunch) for children aged 6-12 years at some summer school locations. You have to pay for this care. You can find more information here: www.sommerschule-freizeit.at.

Here is some important information about summer school:

1. When is summer school?

In the last two weeks of the summer holidays: 19th August until 30th August 2024

2. How can I register my child for summer school?

You can get the registration form from your child's school. You must give this back to the class teacher by the **26**th of April **2024** at the latest.

3. Can I de-register my child from summer school?

If you register your child for summer school, they must go to school for the whole two weeks. It causes a lot of extra work, if children are de-registered at the last minute.

4. Who teaches at the summer school?

Teachers and student teachers teach the lessons. Children are also helped by ,Buddies'.

5. How are lessons at summer school organised?

- Lessons take place in small groups of 6 to a maximum of 15 children.
- Children of different ages and school levels can be in the same group.
- Special support is given in the following subjects:
 - German, maths and science for children in primary school.
 - o German, maths and English for children in lower secondary school.
- The aim is to help children get better in these subjects.
